IOWA TESTS OF BASIC SKILLS & IOWA TESTS OF EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Iowa Tests of Basic Skills (ITBS) and Iowa Tests of Educational Development (ITED) are given in grades 3-8 and in grades 9, 10, and 11.

The lowa Tests of Basic Skills and the lowa Tests of Educational Development are achievement tests. Achievement refers to the level of a student's skills and knowledge in particular areas such as reading, math, and language. Achievement tests are one way of finding out what level he/she is presently doing.

These tests are important because they tell teachers and parents many things about each individual child and about each school. The same test is given in schools all over the country and the scores are based on the average performance of the children taking the test, usually called the "norm."

This means a student's scores can be compared to those of his/her classmates and those of children the same age in other schools. The tests help tell us what a child can do and is doing in relation to others in the same grade.

Once this is known, steps can be taken to improve any weak areas and develop a better educational program for each child.

Tests are only one indication of student achievement. Test scores by themselves do not give a full picture of the child as a student or as a person. The child has abilities and talents test scores do not measure.

The scores are a form of standardized score, referred to as percentiles. The percentile ranks reported in the tables represent school ranks and not pupil ranks. A percentile rank of 93 for third, for example, means that Bettendorf's third grade ranked higher than 93 percent of the schools tested in the national or lowa sample at the same grade level.

Iowa Tests of Basic Skills are administered in grades 3-8 in the fall of each year. Iowa Tests of Educational Development are administered in grades 9-11 in the fall of each year.

Setting Goals with ITBS and ITED Results - Standards

- 1. The principal will provide each teacher or group of teachers with a <u>Teachers Guide</u> for ITBS and ITED for their referral and for following the step-by-step process.
- The principal will review the current year <u>lowa</u> norms that are found of the <u>Report of System Averages</u>. Test scores five percentile points below the state average may become school improvement goals for possible improvement.
- 3. Those low scores designated for that grade level will be systematically traced through the <u>Group</u> Item Analysis print out and a list of scores for individual tests and skill designations will be made.
- 4. The principal will instruct the teachers in interpreting the <u>Skills Objectives</u> listed in detail in the <u>Teachers Guide</u>. Teachers will list the specific skill objectives under each test as determined by the percentile score set in #2, 5 percentile points below the state average.
- 5. The principal will assist the teachers in using <u>Suggestions for Developing Skills</u> in the areas the low percentile tests cover. From these suggestions, and other sources, the principal and teachers will determine a plan to improve the skills, found below the percentile scores set in #2, for these classes for these tests.
- The current year ITBS and ITED scores will be compared to prior year ITBS and ITED scores for signs of improvement. A written report will be submitted to the Assistant Superintendent by the last week in May.
