

# **New Grant Wood Elem Project Update**

Work on the new Grant Wood Elementary School is well underway. At the April 3 board meeting, directors approved the schematic drawings for a \$16.7M new school that will be located behind the current school at 1423 Hillside Dr.

"The staff, parents and students are very excited about our new school," said John Cain, Grant Wood Elementary Principal. "We look forward to the next steps of the process as we can visualize through the schematic design how our new facility is coming together. As we continue to work with the design team, our staff and families are excited about this opportunity and the change we will experience over the next vear."



Legat Architects are working on the detail designs scheduled to be completed in early June. Contractor bids are scheduled for approval June through early fall. Estes Construction is managing the construction work, scheduled to begin this fall. The goal is for the Grant Wood Elementary project to be completed for the beginning of the 2018-2019 school year as Grant Wood transitions from a 2 to a 3 section school to help reduce elementary class size in the district.

Mark Twain and Thomas Jefferson elementary schools are slated to be the next elementary schools for facility improvements.

In May 2016, the Bettendorf Community School District completed a process of developing a 10-year elementary facilities plan. The Elementary Facility Advisory Committee recommended remodeling and construction at each elementary school to meet elementary facility standards and create 21st-century quality learning environments as well as equity across the district.



# **2017-2018 Property** Tax Rate - \$13.86

At the April 4 meeting of the Bettendorf Board of Education, directors approved the 2017/2018 levy rate of \$13.86 per \$1,000 taxable valuation, a \$.02 increase per \$1,000 taxable valuation compared to the 2016/2017 rate of \$13.84.

"Supplemental State Aid (SSA) has recently been approved for 1.1%," said Dallon Christensen, Director of Business and Financial Services, Bettendorf Community School District. "That is \$73 more per pupil for our district, making our 2017/2018 per pupil reimbursement \$6,738."

The total fiscal year 2018 budget shows maximum expenditures up to \$84 million. Of that, the regular education budget is \$68.7 million, which is comprised of 18% new facilities, 68% salary/benefits and 14% other services and supplies.

# **Online Registration**

#### Busing

The request for busing is also online! Go to the district website at www.bettendorf.k12.ia.us. Select Services from the top menu bar; then Transportation and BCSD Transportation Request

#### Free and Reduced / Student Fee Waiver

The Free & Reduced application for school meals is online as well. Access the application through your Parent Portal account. In the left menu bar, select Applications/Forms and then Meals Benefits Application. When completing the application for free or reduced lunch, applicants will be able to select "permission to share" for the Student Fee Waiver which requests consideration for other discounted fees, such as busing and student fees.

If you are not filing a Free & Reduced application but do wish to be considered eligible for other reduced fees, you must complete a separate Student Fee Waiver. The form is available at your school building or online on the District website (www. bettendorf.k12.ia.us). Select Services from the top menu bar; then Nutrition Services and Student Fee Waiver.

#### Fee Payment

Registration and fee payment are two separate actions. You must complete both actions. Registration is not complete without fee payment. Fees may be made in your building or, for your convenience, you may pay fees online through PaySchools (link is available on the district and individual school websites).

#### Iowa Assessment Results

# **BCSD Students Performing Above AEA** & State Average

2016-2017 Iowa Assessments test results show that **Bettendorf Community School District students** continue to perform above AEA and state averages.

The results reflect Iowa Assessments analysis of student proficiency (how many students meet a certain score deemed proficient) and growth (how much students improve) on major

domains of the Iowa Core Standards in reading, mathematics and science.

This data is combined with other assessments and interventions including daily teacher observations, formative assessment (quick tests of understanding) and summative (tests at the end of a subject) to help address four essential questions:

- 1. What do we expect our students to learn? Goals/ Expectations
- 2. How will we know they are learning? Assessment
- 3. How will we respond when they don't learn? Intervention
- 4. How will we respond if they already know it? *Extensions*
