Each week is limited to 50 children. Reservations are on a first-come-first-serve basis and NOT guaranteed without payment. Choose one or any amount of weeks. Day camp is from 9 -3 with drop off between 8:30 -9 a.m. and pick up between 3 - 3:30 p.m. Fees are \$100 first week, \$95 for each additional week for same child. **Note: we do not have a multiple child discount.**

Need more time at camp? Early drop-off is from 7 -8:30 a.m.; late pick-up is from 3:30 -5 p.m. Early drop-off **and/or** late pick-up is a flat fee of \$130 first week, \$125 for each additional week for same child.
