NONRESIDENT STUDENTS REGULATION

I. Guidelines for Continued Attendance of 11th and 12th Grade Students Who Are No Longer Residents of the District

Iowa Open Enrollment law allows 11th and 12th grade students that move out of a district to continue in the district that he/she attended during the preceding school year, tuition-free, until they graduate even though they are no longer residents of the district. These students do not have to file for open enrollment. This does not apply to students that move out of state.

II. Out-of-State Tuition Students

Board of Directors reserve the right to rule on the enrollment of out-of-state tuition students based upon the existing board policies of the school district. The following guidelines are in place for enrollment of out-of-state tuition students:

1. Out-of-State students will not be considered for enrollment until in-district student placements have been determined.
2. The Superintendent or designee will determine prior to the start of the school term which schools have openings for tuition students.
3. Approval must be granted by the Board of Education for enrollment of out-of-state tuition students.
4. Parents must furnish transportation to and from school.
5. Student punctuality and attendance will be the responsibility of parents.
6. Students currently under suspension or expulsion from another school district will not be allowed to apply for tuition into the district until the terms of such disciplinary action have been served, or formal Board action for admittance has been taken.
