COMMUNICABLE DISEASES - STUDENTS REGULATION

I. IMMUNIZATION LAW

- A. The Bettendorf Community School's Board of Education recognizes the importance associated with the control of communicable diseases. Therefore the Board acknowledges it will be in compliance with the law and regulations of the lowa Code, Department of Health and the Department of Education.
- B. The Superintendent of Schools and/or designee is therefore charged with the responsibility to communicate to all residents the requirements of the law, the board's endorsement thereof, and to establish the requirements of parents and student for implementation thereof.

II. COMMUNICABLE DISEASE CONTROL

Students with communicable diseases are to be excluded from school for the period of time that their condition may endanger the health of others. A signed permit from a doctor may be required for reentry if so designated by the Superintendent of Schools and/or designee.

III. CONFIDENTIALITY OF INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Schools and/or designee is hereby charged with the responsibility for establishing regulations to protect the confidentiality of student records related to Immunization and Contagious Disease.

IV. POLICY IMPLEMENTATION

The Superintendent of Schools and/or designee shall be the responsible official to carry out the Contagious Disease Control policy and develop regulations to implement said policy.
