Student Achievement

Learn about the district's Iowa Assessment results and the variety of assessments used by the district as well as how the assessment results are used to help improve the success of students.

The Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP) recently replaced the Iowa Assessments as Iowa's main state accountability test for all students. It's a new test with questions that correlate to Iowa

Core – the required learning standards. Testing is in the spring – which allows for a better measure for what students have learned during the year, rather than fall testing.

There are 3 performance levels: advanced, proficient and not yet proficient. If you did into the data from state comparing to state average you notice that our district has fewer non proficient students than the state average and higher proficiency. The district uses the data to measure student achievement and identify student groups and areas that need targeted attention. Student test results are shared with parents and students as well and used by teachers for targeted learning.

The SIAC group looked over the district’s 2019 ISASP data and wrote note about what they wonder about regarding the tests and results. The presenters answered questions about the data and the test.

The ISASP is one test measurement we use. We also use other tests to help identify our students understanding of curriculum and learning progress.
